Bromeliad Society of South Florida: Thank You

I am very happy to report back that my experience of being able to attend and participate in the 1^{st} World Congress of Bromeliaceae

E v o l u t i o n (BromEvo) in M a r c h w a s e x t r e m e l y successful. The support of this club was a significant help and was e x t r e m e l y appreciated. I was able to present b o t h m y



preliminary results of my genetic research on the genus *Hechtia* and also to represent the BSI to start building stronger ties to the research community and to highlight our relatively new

Harry Luther Scholars Fund. My research uses a very new technique that drew quite a bit of interest and will hopefully make an impact on several other projects being worked on by researchers in Europe and in Latin America. The conference was attended by around 150 registrants, with the far majority being from Brazil. There were at least six research groups representing Europe (mostly German, but also Austrian, a Swiss group, and a British professor). Many other Latin American countries were represented, but unfortunately a few key countries were not represented (Ecuador and Venezuela for example). And I was the lone representative from the US. As this was the first event, it is expected that the next one will build off of this success and draw more of the researchers from around the world, especially some of the big Brazilian researchers who were not able to attend. One great thing to see was how many young researchers While not all of them will participated. continue with their entire career working on the Bromeliaceae, it is sure that many of them will. Having that many young and emerging researchers in Latin America is a very good sign!

The first two days were filled with symposia and invited conferences covering many different topics. They ranged from floristic inventories, pharmacological activity, modes of evolution, population genetics, and reproductive biology/pollination. The evenings allowed for the display of artwork of three Brazilian artists and poster sessions with over 60 posters highlighting even more research projects.

The final day was full of shorter talks by students and professors (and me) covering some

of the newer projects showing what is in progress. Several of the students participated in the competition section where their presentations on their research were judged by professors. That afternoon the conference was wrapped up with an

interesting talk on inselbergs around the world and how they relate especially to the bromeliads in Brazil followed by planning sessions where the researchers met in groups to discuss strategy of new collaborations and ways to work together. That evening many of the Brazilian students (and yes, even some of the professors) had an informal party at a bar overlooking the beach that lasted well into the night (unfortunately I needed to leave 'early' to get at least 2 hours of sleep before heading out on a field trip the next morning!). But even in that informal social time, much was accomplished in building relationships and possible future collaborations.

The next morning about 15 of us from the conference began a two day trip to visit habitats in the dry caatinga inland from Recife. This was led by Professor Marccus Alves and some of his students. We climbed all over granite formations to look at *Aechmeas*, *Bromelias*, *Encholiriums*, *Hohenbergias*, *Orthophtyums*, *Tillandsias*, and *Vrieseas*—and even an *Anthurium bromelicola* that only lives in the leaves and tanks of large *Aechmeas* and *Porteas*! The highlight was climbing a large inselberg that rose well over 1000' above where we started the hike. And it even required ropes to make the final ascent to the peak.

All in all, it was an amazing trip and the support from your club was a great help. It is certainly worth meeting more of the researchers studying the bromeliads around the world and hopefully we can involve more of them in our World

Bromeliad Conferences. Maybe even something more might be able to develop in the future... Thank you again for your support!
