In Case You Missed It

At the June meeting, Nick Bethmann, visiting from the north, treated BSSF members to a presentation on biogeneric bromeliads. North, of course, is a relative term, and in this case it means Palm Beach County. Nick, a resident of Boca Raton and a director of the Bromeliad Society of the Palm Beaches, has been hybridizing bromeliads since 2008, and three of his crosses are registered with the Bromeliad Society International's Cultivar Register (http://registry.bsi.org/). (He has

even made a trigeneric, but hasn't registered it.) The BCR is open to everyone, and someone other than the breeder can register a hybrid.

Nick wryly noted that the botanical term for a genus that is a hybrid or cross is nothogenus; it is derived from the Greek word for bastard. It turns out that those little bastards are sterile, and many are of low quality, so creating desirable, successful bigeneric hybrids is no easy undertaking. But through hard work and patience, Nick has been able to obtain hybrids even among members of separate subfamilies.

Nick's biogeneric hybrids include a number of crosses between Neoregelia and Aechmea: xNeomea 'After All,' xNeomea 'Bacon,' xNeomea 'Pox,'

xNeomea 'Outback,' and xNeomea 'Ramble.' He offered some thumbnail descriptions of other bigenerics that he likes: His xNiduregelia 'Cherry Quasar,' which features a dark red center, was registered in 2009. xQuesregelia 'Jewellery Box, 'a hybrid whose seed parent is Quesnelia marmorata, has a beautiful purple, green and red inflorescence. xQuesregelia 'Pioneer,' another Q. marmorata cross, has an inflorescence suffused with purple. xCanmea Ko'olau,' whose pollen source is A. correiaaraujoi, features a showy orange and chartreuse inflorescence borne on a spike. An even more prominent spike develops on xVriecantarea 'Seeger,' and the plant pups very well. xNeophytum 'Galactic Warrior,' derived from a sport of xNeophytum 'Ralph

Davis,' has deep red leaves with white margins. xNeophytum 'Burgundy Thrill,' a tissue-cultured sport, reaches over three feet in diameter.

Billbergia is a difficult genus to hybridize. Bethmann's *xBilya 'Alpha*, 'a cross between *B. 'hallelujah'* and *Puya mirabilis*, had to be bred in the middle of the night. It features a spectacular inflorescence.

Nick then shifted his focus from bigenerics in

order to devote some time to the puzzle surrounding Aechmea orlandiana. This plant, endemic to Brazil, was collected by Mulford Foster in 1939 and described by Lyman Smith in 1941. But a controversy ultimately arose: Was it a true species or a hybrid? It bears similarities to both A. fosteriana and A. correia-araujoi. The horticultural 'book' on A. orlandiana indicates following traits: It is amenable to pot, basket, or tree culture (particularly if the tree trunk stays moist). It is tolerant of cold, sun, and drought. It is subject to variegation, particularly the cultivar 'Ensign.' It can be grown easily from seed.

A. orlandiana has been hybridized for years. 'Black Marble' is a nice one. He estimates that there may now be 40 hybrids of A. orlandiana on the Cultivar Register, and about half of them are available. 'White Knight' and 'Haiku' are what he considers the best of those hybrids. He also singles out 'Al's Coppertone' as a good one for making crosses.

Nick concluded his program with this observation: Over time he has become much more judgmental about the quality of his bigeneric crosses. He may have had 1,000 at one time, but he is pickier now.


