ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Dr. Karl Green lived on a dairy farm in New Jersey until he was 5 years old. The family moved to Brooklyn, N.Y. where he grew up and received his education through medical school. After his residency he joined the U.S. Air Force where he served as an orthopedic surgeon. He was stationed for a while at Homestead Air Force Base. After leaving the Air Force he settled in Miami and practiced orthopedic surgery until his retirement in 2000.

He became interested in bromeliads in 1995 when his wife, Kris, purchased an Orthophytum *gurkenii* and

an Aechmea *purpureoro*sea, plants of which he still has specimens. He joined BSSF shortly thereafter and became very active in the club, serving three terms as president. After he was introduced to Elton Leme, a Brazilian judge and renowned bromeliad collector, he traveled to Brazil, and they went on collecting trips in 1999, 2000, and 2006. On one of the trips to Brazil he met Luis Nevares Felipe and brought back 200 different species of bromeliads in a single suitcase. Through Sr. Felipe, Dr. Green was introduced to Roberto Menescal who generously shared many plants from his private collection.

It's absolutely a fact that the bromeliad bug bit Dr. Green. Over the years he had the good fortune to have developed great friendships with Wally Berg (a Floridian), John Anderson (a Texan) and Harry Luther (Sarasota-Selby Gardens, director of the Bromeliad Identification center, speaker for BSSF in years gone by). Descendants of many of the plants these men and others have shared with Dr. Green are in his current collection.

One of the great pleasures of his experiences with bromeliads is having been able to share his own plants with collectors and growers through the years. For the past 27 years or so, Dr. Green has leased space and maintained a species collection at the Bullis Bromeliad Nursery in Homestead, FL that at one time has had over one thousand different bromeliad species. He states, "I am forever grateful to them for allowing me to keep my bromeliad collection there." "I have

been blessed. I have tried to show my appreciation for those who so generously gave their time and treasures to me by passing them on to others." DEAR DR. BROM

Dear Dr. Brom,

Why should I attend the World Conference when there are plenty of bromeliad sellers right here in Miami?

You never know until you go but it is wonderful to see how many people the world over love bromeliads. The speakers would be the number one reason. The speakers come from all over the world. These are people who have had plants and even genera named after them.

Graeme Barclay is a hybridizer and past president of the Bromeliad Society of New Zealand who has a 3 level greenhouse.

Eric Gouda is a professor in the department of biology at the University of Utrecht in the Netherlands. He is curator of the Utrecht University Botanic Garden. He is a prolific author and is currently working on the Encyclopedia of Bromeliads. The new genera, Goudaea, is named in his honor.

The next reason would be the plants. Plants from everywhere. The World Conference is where new species and hybrids are introduced. So if you want the newest, hottest plants this is where you will find them. The plant sale is enormous and the auction is very special. There are two behind the scenes tours of nurseries we have all heard of, Tropiflora and Michael's Bromeliads. A

behind the scenes tour of Marie Selby Botanic Gardens is also offered. And the judged plant show is spectacular.

But the conference is expensive. Registration until May 25 is \$335. So how can you enjoy some of the highlights on a budget?

The show and sale is open to the public on Friday, June 10 and Saturday, June 11. That means no registration fee if you go on those two days. You can also attend the auction Friday evening.

You cannot hear the speakers, attend the banquet or go on the behind the scenes tours.

But both the nurseries and Marie Selby Gardens are open to the public.

You could plan a day trip, visit the show and sale and one nursery and return home.

Or you could spend the night at a less expensive hotel maybe on the outskirts of Sarasota. That way you could visit the show and sale and the auction on Friday, and visit the 2 nurseries and Marie Selby Gardens on Saturday.

Either way you are guaranteed a wonderful time filled with beautiful plants.

Registration information as well as the schedule are attached at the end of the Bromeliadvisory.






BEWARE OF EMAILS
