🜿 Exploring Bromeliads in Peru with Alex Bello



We were fortunate to enjoy a fascinating presentation by our very own President, Alex, who shared insights from his talk *"Exploring Bromeliads in Peru."* One of the many perks of having Alex lead our society is getting a first look at his research and presentations—sometimes we may be his "guinea pigs," but we always walk away having learned something new!

This particular journey was inspired by Alex's friends, who traveled through various regions of Peru. The diversity of the country's landscape was striking—almost the entire area highlighted in red on the map are botanical hotspots. Many bromeliads in these regions grow in extremely dry, full-sun conditions, often with little to no soil, perched on rocks, cliffs, and ledges.

Alex noted how many of these species resemble *Alcantarea*, though many were unidentifiable even to him. These mysterious plants have now become the focus of his continued research. In coastal areas, despite persistent cloud





cover, the conditions remain dry. In contrast, the rainforest regions are full of epiphytic bromeliads like *Guzmanias*, thriving in moss-covered trees with misty light



protecting the plants from sun damage. He also shared that many *Tillandsias* that struggle in our South Florida heat flourish in Peru's highelevation climates.

One standout species discussed was



and gentle drizzle. The sun in Peru, while intense, feels different from the sun here in Florida, and bromeliads have adapted accordingly.

Alex emphasized the role of trichomes—tiny leaf structures that act like shields,

Vriesea Tequendamae



Native to the Andes Region spanning Peru into Bolivia The plant is characterized by its thick, fleshy leaves that are covered in tiny, hair-like scales called trichomes. These trichomes help to absorb moisture and nutrients from the air, allowing the plant to survive in areas with limited rainfall. Vriesea tequendamae typically grows on tree branches, rocks, and other surfaces, using its roots to anchor itself rather than to absorb nutrients. The plant produces vibrant, tubular flowers that are often yellow or orange in color, which attract pollinators such as hummingbirds and bees.

Tillandsia Hildae, the largest species of the genus, which grows directly on rocks without any soil and develops a rich purple hue in Peru, along with a massive inflorescence. Alex grows his in-milk crates, adding fertilizer to support their growth. This plant can be found from Venezuela all the way down to Peru



He also mentioned another plant in his nursery, *Tillandsia pseudofloribunda*, which he is currently observing.

Hotel Reservations

The special hotel room rate for Conference registrants is only \$85.80 per night (\$67.80 plus \$18 resort fee) plus 13.5% taxes. This rate includes free parking and breakfast discounts. Deluxe tower rooms are also available for only \$105 (\$87 plus \$18 resort fee). Rooms are King or 2 Queen bed rooms.

The hotel is the **Ramada Gateway**, 7470 W Irlo Bronson Memorial Hwy 192, Kissimmee, FL 34747. To obtain the conference rate, call the hotel (407-396-4400 or 407-997-6662 from 9am to 5pm) and ask for the special **Bromeliad Extravaganza** rates.

A deposit for one night's room rate plus taxes (\$67.80 plus \$9.16 or \$76.96 for the courtyard or poolview rooms) will be required at the time of booking (refundable up until 72 hours before the scheduled arrival date). The special rates will also be available from Sept. 23rd to 30th for those who would like to make a vacation out of their stay, but you need to book before August 26th to get this special rate. Hotel check-in time is 4pm and check out time is 11am.

You should book the hotel as soon as possible.
