Now's a good time to move sensitive plants to bright, filtered light and consider using shade cloth or sails to protect them from sunburn. A little extra care now will go a long way in keeping your collection healthy and vibrant throughout the season.

Meeting Recap: Hybridizing Bromeliads with Mike Michalski

At our most recent meeting, we were treated to an engaging and educational presentation by Mike, who



shared his hands-on experience and

insights into hybridizing bromeliads. He brought along an impressive inflorescence that had most likely been pollinated by bees and walked us through the process of seed collection and propagation.

Mike showed us the black seed pods on the inflorescence and demonstrated how he extracts the seeds. He gently squeezes the pods into a small container of water to release the seeds and wash off the gooey substance that sometimes surrounds them. While seeds may still germinate with the goo intact, Mike prefers to remove it to prevent potential fungal growth. Once in water, the seeds must be carefully strained—a delicate task, as bromeliad seeds are incredibly tiny.



After drying, the seeds are placed into a growing medium of moss

and perlite inside a small plastic container with a lid—no holes. He avoids using soil, as it tends to harbor weeds and fungus. Mike typically adds fertilizer to the mix, favoring Dynamite as his go-to. He places the containers in bright, indirect light to promote healthy growth.

Some bromeliad seeds may take up to four years to mature, although nurseries may be able to speed up the process.

Once the seedlings reach the lid of the container, which can take over a year,



Mike separates them. He noted that Billbergias are among the easiest bromeliads to hybridize, and that perlite serves as a solid base for holding the seeds.

Mike also displayed several stunning examples of his hybridized plants. Interestingly, many of the resulting plants look nothing like the parent plants, often producing entirely unique appearances.





When asked about mosquito concerns in bromeliads, Mike suggested using a screwdriver to poke small holes in the base of the cup to allow water to drain out. Patty added that Mike heads out each morning with his trusty kitchen tongs to inspect their bromeliads, looking for those in bloom or already producing seeds.


We had a wonderful turnout and the food was fantastic—thank you to

Hotel Reservations

The special hotel room rate for Conference registrants is only \$85.80 per night (\$67.80 plus \$18 resort fee) plus 13.5% taxes. This rate includes free parking and breakfast discounts. Deluxe tower rooms are also available for only \$105 (\$87 plus \$18 resort fee). Rooms are King or 2 Queen bed rooms.

The hotel is the **Ramada Gateway**, 7470 W Irlo Bronson Memorial Hwy 192, Kissimmee, FL 34747. To obtain the conference rate, call the hotel (407-396-4400 or 407-997-6662 from 9am to 5pm) and ask for the special **Bromeliad Extravaganza** rates.

A deposit for one night's room rate plus taxes (\$67.80 plus \$9.16 or \$76.96 for the courtyard or poolview rooms) will be required at the time of booking (refundable up until 72 hours before the scheduled arrival date). The special rates will also be available from Sept. 23rd to 30th for those who would like to make a vacation out of their stay, but you need to book before August 26th to get this special rate. Hotel check-in time is 4pm and check out time is 11am.

You should book the hotel as soon as possible.
